3% thru taste

3% through smell

6% through touch

13% through hearing

75% through seeing

Over a prolonged time period

We retain.

10% of all we read

20% of all we hear

30% of all we see

50% of all we see and hear at same time.

75% of all we see, hear, and do at the same time.

Visual aids will hold the attention of children.

Visuals will help you gain control and control attention, clarify points and add interest.

Visual aids will tell more using less words. "A picture is worth a thousand words."
