Teachers and Classrooms: _____ is key. Teachers and helpers should be consistent.

1. Each child should _____ a class of their peers and be allowed to participate as much as possible.
2. The _____ in the classroom or Sunday School should be similar each week.
3. The classroom itself should not be overly stimulating, i.e., wall decorations and paint colors.

Visual aids are _____. Incorporate Bible lesson pictures, verse visuals, object lessons, and personal visual folders. Each of these will all aid in the learning and attention of the child.

Patience:

- a. Be _____ with each child as new situations, overly visually stimulating areas, experiences, and people can be a trigger.
- b. _____ may become obvious such as biting, getting angry, refusing to move, noises, or facial movements.

“Stimming” refers to self-stimulating behavior, which are repetitive physical or verbal tics common in individuals with autism. To some degree, we all exhibit stimming behaviors.

- a. If a child is stimming, speak _____ and redirect the child to their folder or something that the parent or guardian reported as a favorite object, color, or activity.
- b. _____ are helpful in overstimulated situations.
- c. Fidget toys - give the child an object. Something as simple as a rubber pencil tube or other fidget toys, an item in each hand will help them feel _____.

Redirection: There are several ways to _____ the child who is struggling in the new environment or having a meltdown. A meltdown is an intense response to overwhelming circumstances.

Visual Schedule Folders: Using a plastic pocket folder.

- a. The Visual _____ will give them the ability to communicate with the teacher or helper.
- b. Using the front of the folder to apply Velcro strips.
- c. Print and laminate symbols (PECS) to apply to Velcro.
- d. Use PECS cards to _____ visually the schedule for the class time. (sit, read, Snacks, Bible lesson, Song, game, bathroom, coloring, craft, memory verse, go home as the last picture)
- e. On the back of the folder use the (1st / then) visual method. Using two columns, one labeled “1st” and the other “then” you will place the schedule. Under the 1st column a picture of the Bible lesson and under the “then” column it will have a snack. Example: Show the child the visual and say, “First we listen to the Bible lesson then we have a snack.”
- f. Use the 1st / then to _____ in a meltdown.

- g. Keep any necessary paperwork as well as fidgets and coloring pages in the folder.
